ABOUT ASP

PURPOSE:

- 1. TO ACCELERATE THE LEARNING PROCESS
- 2. TO GREATLY ENHANCE RETENTION
- 3. TO MAKE ASP PRACTICE ACCESSIBLE TO YOUNG AND OLD OF BOTH SEXES
- 4. TO COVER ALL ESSENTIAL AREAS OF SELF-PROTECTION, BEYOND SELF-DEFENSE AND COMPETITIVE ASPECTS OF FIGHTING SPORTS AND ARTS
- 5. ALL OF THE ABOVE WITH SAFE PRACTICE.

HOW IS THIS ACHIEVED:

- 1. WITH THE SYSTEMATIC USE OF THE FIVE PRINCIPLES (distance, direction, timing, momentum, leverage)
- 2. WITH THE USE OF ONLY A FEW SIMPLE MOTIONS APPLICABLE AGAINST MANY ATTACKS, SO THAT BY REPETITION THEY BECOME SECOND NATURE
- 3. A **FIRST DEGREE BLACK BELT** PROGRAM THAT IS WELL-ROUNDED AND GIVES A SIMPLE, ALL-AROUND METHOD OF DEFENSE STANDING AND ON THE GROUND, ACCESSIBLE TO YOUNG AND OLD OF BOTH SEXES, WHILE ADDRESSING MAN AS A WHOLE. THIS PROGRAM IS SUFFICIENT IN ITSELF FOR ESSENTIAL SELF-PROTECTION. INCLUDING SELF-DEFENSE, IT

- COMPRISES PSYCHOSOMATIC EXERCISES FOR MIND-BODY COORDINATION
- 4. **SECOND AND THIRD DEGREE BLACK BELT** PROGRAMS PREPARE MEN AND WOMEN FOR EXPANDED KNOWLEDGE INCLUDING MORE THROWS, COMBINATIONS, WRIST AND ARM LOCKS

TECHNIQUES FROM OUR PROGRAMS TAKEN OUT OF CONTEXT ARE NOT ASP AND DO NOT DEMONSTRATE THE ASP METHOD AND SYSTEM

- 5. PROMOTIONAL REQUIREMENTS FOR THE FIRST THREE DEGREES GIVEN ABOVE ARE ONLY THOSE INCLUDED IN THE ASP TEXTBOOK. THIS MAKES ASP AN EFFICENT, TRIED, TRUE, AND ACCESSIBLE SYSTEM AND METHOD. THESE THREE PROGRAMS ARE THE BASIS OF ALL ASP AND SHOULD NOT BE ALTERED IN ANY WAY
- 6. HIGHER ASP RANKS ALLOW FOR CONSIDERABLE LATITUDE IN CREATIVITY AND INNOVATION WITHIN THE SPIRIT OF ASP
- 7. THE FOURTH DEGREE BLACK BELT (KICKBOXING) BUILDS UPON THE BASIC KNOWLEDGE OF KICKS ACQUIRED EARLIER AND REFERS TO WHAT HAPPENS INITIALLY IN A FIGHT.
- 8. THE FIFTH DEGREE (GRAPPLING) BUILDS UPON EARLIER KNOWLEDGE OF THROWS, ARM AND WRIST LOCKS AND REFERS TO WHAT USUALLY HAPPENS IF STANDING FIGHTING IS INCONCLUSIVE AND BOTH ADVERSARIES GO TO THE GROUND
- 9. THE SIXTH DEGREE (STICKFIGHTING) BUILDS UPON KNOWN BASIC ELEMENTS WITH ONLY SEVEN MOTIONS OF THE STICK. A STICK BEING THE MOST INCONSPICUOUS WEAPON ONE COULD CARRY
- 10. <u>HIGHER RANKS</u> REQUIRE COMBINED KNOWLEGDE OF THE ABOVE AND TEACHING ASP FOR THE TRAINING OF BLACK BELT INSTRUCTORS. THEY ALSO INCLUDE OTHER ESSENTIAL SELF-PROTECTIVE KNOWLEDGE.

EDITORIAL

Fifty years since its inception, ASP is alive and well. It was recently re-incorporated in Ohio as a non-profit corporation. After the disappointing performance of the leadership of the Illinois Chapter, our Association has been awarded a non-profit status by the IRS and has a web site. Several black belts have been trained and are qualified to teach. All this, in spite of the massive media propaganda for the Oriental martial arts and without a single professional ASP school.

The majority of our students and instructors are college graduates and professionals. ASP appeals to their intelligence by its simplicity, its pragmatic approach, its democratic spirit, and lack of hype. Physical educators of note who had no axe to grind have recognized the value of ASP and its originator was invited to chair the Health and Physical Education Research Methods Conferences held in Chicago, IL in '69 and

'70. The Administrators for the Council on Physical Fitness and Sports under Presidents Johnson and Bush Sr. expressed keen interest in the ASP method and system.

Now in the Twenty-first Century, we expect ASP to receive the recognition it deserves through the dedication of our members.

We had our share of those who claimed to understand ASP but did not but just used it for their purposes. Others gave in to the fascination of the Oriental mystique and reverted to the morass of individual techniques. Yet all those who understood ASP and practiced it gathered its benefits in their personal lives even at an advanced age. People in their sixties still practice ASP, not only in form, but also in substance and active participation. There are not many of those in the Oriental martial arts.

SOME ANSWERS TO INQUIRIES ABOUT ASP

- 1. ASP IS A NOVEL APPROACH TO COMBATIVE AND SELF-PROTECTIVE KNOWLEDGE
- 2. ONE HAS TO QUALIFY FOR TEACHING ASP; NO MATTER HOW QUALIFIED HE/SHE IS IN **ANY** MARTIAL ART.
- 3. THERE IS NO RANK EQUIVALENCE BETWEEN ASP AND THE MARTIAL ARTS. UNBEKNOWN TO MOST, THERE IS NO EQUIVALENCE OF RANKS BETWEEN THE VARIOUS MARTIAL ARTS THEMSELVES EITHER.
- 4. ASSUMING AN OPEN MIND, THE MORE ONE IS QUALIFIED THE FASTER HE/SHE WILL PROGRESS. ALL PREVIOUS MARTIAL ARTS KNOWLEDGE WILL FALL INTO PLACE
- 5. AN OPEN MIND MEANS GETTING AWAY FROM THE PRECOCEIVED NOTIONS OF PIECEMEAL INDIVIDUAL TECHNIQUES TO A SYSTEMATIC APPROACH TO LEARNING USING PRINCIPLES AND ELEMENTS OF MOTION
- 6. TO GRASP FUNDAMENTAL ASP, ONE HAS TO QUALIFY FOR THE FIRST THREE BLACK BELT DEGREES, THE BASIS OF ALL ASP
- 7. FOR AREAS WITHOUT QUALIFIED INSTRUCTORS ONE MAY QUALIFY THROUGH SELF-STUDY AND EXAMS USING VHS VIDEOS. THESE SHALL BE RETURNED TO THE SENDER WITH COMMENTS AND DEMOS FOR CORRECTIONS
- 8. THERE ARE EXAMINATION FEES. SHIPPING CHARGES ARE AT COST. <u>FEES</u>: \$30.00 FOR EACH RED BELT, \$50.00 FOR EACH BROWN BELT, \$150.00 FOR THE FIRST DEGREE BLACK BELT, AND \$200.00 FOR ALL OTHER BLACK BELT RANKS
- 9. BEFORE BEING CONSIDERED A STUDENT MUST JOIN A.S.P.A. INC. BY COMPLETING AND SIGNING AN APPLICATION IN THE PRESENCE OF TWO WITNESSES AND SENDING A CHECK OR M.O. ESSENTIAL CONSIDERATIONS AND REQUIREMENTSITEMS FOR ASP AND ASPA.

Remarks by Dr. Baltazzi during the Annual ASPA, Inc. Meeting on 3/6/04

ASP has to offer simplicity, efficacy, accessibility, good retention, and well-rounded connected knowledge. If ASP IS TO SURVIVE ITS BASIC PROGRAMS BBI-III MUST BE ACCESSIBLE TO TEENS AND SENIORS OF BOTH SEXES. Else it will have nothing to offer different from the martial arts. Therefore:

- 1. Additions to programs must be made VERY CAREFULLY and only because they fit the above criteria, without duplicating existing ASP techniques and without adding unnecessary bulk making the existing programs unwieldy. Else, such additions will spell the end of ASP. It will become another "martial art" and out of competition. Fifty years of personal experience have abundantly proven this.
- 2. Particularly, the first degree Black Belt program must remain widely accessible, just like the shodan in Japan; it must not be an end in itself but the reward for a successful BEGINNER. Because the BBI program is well rounded, if made too hard, complex, and inaccessible, students will think that they have nothing more to learn and will drop out. I know from experience.
- 3. The BBI program has technique reviews deliberately built in it and the instructor must show flexibility without handing out ranks to those who are unworthy of them. The key points are important, refinements come along the way.
- 4. The requirements for BBI-III ASP are laid down in the basic book and should not be changed. The few stickfighting techniques are for the BrBII are optional and not required knowledge. They give the student a taste of future programs, that is all. The instructor with the clear understanding that they are NOT promotional requirements for the BBI-III ASP may show other techniques such as wrist controls combinations and stickfighting. But he should be particularly careful in this area lest he will confuse the students with variations and alternatives, thus distracting them from the essential program. Instructors should show alien to a given program techniques very sparingly and only to illustrate the tenor of higher programs.
- 5. The three first degrees BB ASP are the basis on which ASP stands and should be treated as such. Instructors qualified in other M.A. may teach them if they wish, SEPARATELY FROM ASP and should NOT include any of their techniques in the ASP programs. If an instructor is not convinced that ASP has something special to offer, he should quit it.
- 6. From BBIV on, techniques may be added freely provided they fit the ASP criteria. Instructors who followed the above guidelines were successful in attracting many students. Those who, fascinated by the oriental arts techniques, deviated from them were not successful in keeping their students, particularly the Black Belts they had trained. In the end their ASP program folded up.

- 1. Since this was the first meeting of ASPA after its incorporation in Ohio there was no minutes of any previous meeting to be read
- 2. According to our by-laws the present officers and directors have four more years to serve, therefore there were no elections.

- 4. Designs for new diplomas for undergraduates and black belts were discussed and approved
- 5. Lapel pins for undergraduates and black belts will be ordered
- 6. The new membership fees were unanimously approved. There will be no new life memberships
- 7. No officer or director will receive any compensation for his services as in the past
- 8. Competitions to be held as soon as convenient.
- 9. Access to the web site by Troy Schultz and Gary Cook in consultation with Dr. Baltazzi
- 10. Meeting adjourned at 11:50.
